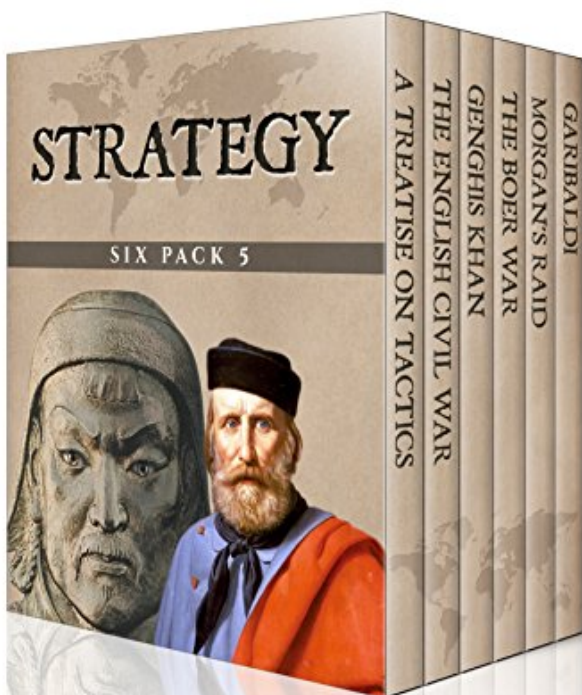

Basil Wilson Duke (May 28, 1838 September 16, 1916) was a Confederate general officer during the American Civil War. His most noted service in the war was as second-in-command for his brother-in-law John Hunt Morgan; Duke would later write a popular account of Morgan's most famous raid: 1863's *Morgan's Raid*. George Alfred Henty (1832 1902) was a prolific English novelist and war correspondent. He is best known for his historical adventure stories that were popular in the late 19th century. Thomas Henry Hines (October 8, 1838 January 23, 1898) was a Confederate cavalryman who was known for his spying activities during the last two years of the American Civil War. Elbert Green Hubbard (June 19, 1856 May 7, 1915) was an American writer, publisher, artist, and philosopher. Among his many publications were the nine-volume work *Little Journeys to the Homes of the Great*. He died aboard the *Lusitania*, when it was sunk by a German submarine off the coast of Ireland on May 7, 1915. Francis J. Lippitt (1812 1902) was a lawyer and veteran of the Mexican American War and Colonel and Brigadier General in the American Civil War. Orlando Bolivar Willcox (April 16, 1823 May 11, 1907) was an American soldier who served as a general in the Union Army during the American Civil War.
